A. The top level menu is Women's Health Menu			
[WVMENU].			
B. The menu used to Enter/View Patient Data is Patient			
Management [WV MENU-PATIENT MANAGEMENT].			
C. The menu used to Enter/View Site Parameters is File			
Maintenance Menu [WV MENU-FILE			
MAINTENANCE] which is under the Manager's			
Functions [WV MENU-MANAGER'S FUNCTIONS]			
menu.			
D. The following files are populated by the package and are not			
editable by the users:			
1) 790.2 WV PROCEDURE TYPE (30 entries)			
2) 790.03 WV PAP REGIMEN (16 entries)			
3) 790.31 WV RESULTS/DIAGNOSIS (145 entries)			
4) 790.403 WV NOTIFICATION TYPE (13 entries)			
5) 790.5 WV CERVICAL TX NEED (13 entries)			
6) 790.51 WV BREAST TX NEED (15 entries)			
7) 790.6 WV LETTER (1 entry)			
E. The following files are editable by the site. Use the File			
Maintenance Menu [WV MENU-FILE			
MAINTENANCE] to edit these files.			
1) 790.01 WV CASE MANAGER.			
a) If there are any entries in this file from the GOLD			
account, delete them and start over.			

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b) Identify any users who will be acting as Women's			
Health Case Managers. Make certain there is at least			
one entry in this file. Use the Add/Edit Case			
Managers [WV ADD/EDIT CASE MANAGERS]			
option.			
c) This file is pointed to by files 790 and 790.02.			
2) 790.02 WV SITE PARAMTER			
a) If there are any entries in this file from the GOLD			
account, delete them and start over.			
b) Identify as many facilities in the file as will be needed.			
Make certain there is at least one entry in this file.			
(a) Identify a Default Case Manager. (Page 1 of the			
data entry.)			
(b) The PAP Result Normal Letter and MAM Result			
Normal Letter fields point to entries in File			
790.404.			
(c) The package has links to the VistA Radiology and			
Laboratory packages. When the mammogram			
(Radiology) and Pap smear (Laboratory) results			
are verified, these packages notify the Women's			
Health Package to determine if those results will			
be tracked based on the parameters on page 2 of			
this option.			
(d) Pages 3 through 6 identify 30 procedures that can			
be tracked in the package. All of them do not have			
to be tracked. The site can identify which ones to			
track or ignore.			
(e) Use the option Edit Site Parameters [WV EDIT			
SITE PARAMETERS].			
3) 790.32 WV DIAGNOSTIC CODE TRANSLATION			
a) If there are any entries in this file from the GOLD			

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account, delete them and start over.			
b) This file links entries from File 790.31 with local			
Radiology Diagnostic codes (File 78.3), so the			
Radiology package diagnoses can be converted into			
Women's Health package diagnoses codes.			
c) Use the option Edit Diagnostic Code Translation			
File [WV EDIT DIAG TRANSLATION].			
4) 790-404 WV NOTIFICATION PURPOSE			
a) There may be entries from the GOLD account and			
they will not present a problem if left. Some of the			
entries may have been exported at the beginning of			
the package. Some were added with patch			
WV*1.0*16 which linked Women's Health with			
Clinical Reminders and CPRS. This file contains the			
boilerplate text for letters to remind patients of future			
appointments or the results of their completed tests.			
b) Review the text and customize it to the needs of the			
current VAMC. Use the option Add/Edit a			
Notification Purpose & Letter [WV ADD/EDIT			
NOT PURPOSE&LETTER].			
5) 790.405 WV NOTIFICATION OUTCOME			
a) There may be entries from the GOLD account and			
they will not present a problem if left. Some of the			
entries may have been exported at the beginning of			
the package.			
b) Use the option Add/Edit Notification Outcomes			
[WV ADD/EDIT NOTIF OUTCOME].			
6) 790.07 WV REFERRAL SOURCE			
a) There may be entries from the GOLD account and			
they will not present a problem if left. Some of the			
entries may have been exported at the beginning of			

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the package.			
b) Use the option Add/Edit to Referral Source File			
[WV ADD/EDIT REFERRAL SOURCE].			
7) The following files are not populated with any data when			
the package is first installed. Use FileMan to delete any			
entries in these files which are not related to your site.			
These files grow as patients are tracked. Files 790,790.1			
and 790.4 will grow steadily as the package is used. The			
others will grow very little and perhaps not at all. For			
example, File 790.71 saves values from previous reports			
to establish a history of package use, but if the site never			
runs the report (some do not) there may never be any data			
in this file.

b) 790.04 WV PAP REGIMEN LOG

2. Other functionality on the File Maintenance Menu.			
A. Option, Automatically Load Patients [WV AUTOLOAD			
PATIENTS]			
1) This option will "seed" File 790 (WV Patient) with			
patients how have been seen at the facility in the date			
range selected. If the option is used, be very careful about			
selecting a long date range. It is best to go back only a			
few months and review how many patients are added.			

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Otherwise, it may add a lot of patients that are not			
wanted.			
B. Option, Import Radiology/NM Exams [WV IMPORT			
RAD/NM EXAMS]			
1) This option will "seed" Files 790 and 790.1 (WV			
Procedure) with patients and mammogram results for the			
date range selected. Use caution if using this option.			
Select a small and recent date range; review the files			
before running it again to add additional entries.			
C. Option, Link Pap Smear with SNOMED Codes [WV PAP			
SMEAR SNOMED CODES]			
1) Use this option to identify the Morphology and			
Topography codes used by the Lab Service for Pap			
Smears. Contact the Lab Service to find out what those			
codes are.			
2) When a lab test is resulted the Women's Health software			
will use these codes to determine if the test is a pap smear			
and should be tracked.
